JOB SUMMARY

Delivers primary care to patients in outpatient and inpatient settings. The scope of the problems managed will include those conditions, which the physician's specialty training usually would encompass. This does not exclude further training and skills individual physicians may acquire.

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Provides direct patient care as per contract with CHC, maintain an adequate clinical volume to support the CHC Mission.
2. Supervising APC's, which involves but is not limited to, clinical teaching, providing direct feedback on patient encounters, and signing charts. While on call, physicians will be available to backup the APC taking phone call.
3. Supervises residents or students, providing appropriate back-up, chart review, and clinical teaching in accordance with institutional policies.
4. Attends provider meetings and other meetings as required.
5. Maintains hospital privileges at all hospitals used by CHC. Physicians will be accessible to the residents and hospital nursing staff to manage patient care issues as indicated by the call schedule.
6. Completes patient records, billing sheets, and leave requests in accordance with the policies of CHC. Physicians will respond to requests for information regarding these issues in a timely fashion.
7. Participates as requested in Quarterly Assurance activities.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Physician is to be board eligible for his/her specialty when hired.
2. Within 18 months of hire, board certification is to be complete.
3. After certification, the physician will meet CME and recertification standards for his/her specialty.
4. Sufficient training and experience to obtain independent privileges in non-surgical obstetrics.

ADDITIONAL NOTE

- Prolonged periods sitting at a desk and working on a computer.
- Prolonged periods of standing and bending.
- Must be able to lift up to 15 pounds at times.
- Typical setting is a clinical patient facing position.
- Typical setting is in an office with moderate noise level reviewed.
